All of our residents are encouraged to enjoy their meals in the dining room on their unit. Our attentive staff is available to help those in need of assistance with their meals.

Living Center at Geneva — North

Living Center at Geneva – North, 75 Mason Street, Geneva, offers 80 skilled nursing beds and 2 respite beds for scheduled short-term stays.

The facility features spacious semi-private, deluxe semi-private and private rooms that are very comfortable and attractively decorated. All rooms are based upon availability.

In addition, we offer numerous lounges. Each area provides ample space for our residents to socialize and relax with friends and families.

Complementing the broad range of highly skilled nursing and rehabilitation services we provide, the Living Center at Geneva – North also offers respite care.

Respite care provides temporary, 24-hour skilled nursing care, nutritious meals, and recreational activities. This service is ideal for a caregiver who needs a break from the caregiving role for personal reasons such as medical needs, vacation or necessary travel.

Living Center at Geneva — South

Living Center at Geneva – South, 45 Mason Street, Geneva, a 103 bed facility, offers 71 skilled nursing beds as well as 32 rehabilitation beds on the Transitional Care Unit.

At the Living Center at Geneva – South, we provide a safe and comfortable environment for the well-being of our residents. Semi-private and private rooms are offered, as available. Two large outdoor patio areas and a gazebo are available for the enjoyment of our residents and their visitors. Three dining rooms - one on each floor - allow for residents on the same unit the ability to dine together with familiar residents and staff.

Living Center at Geneva – South also features our Transitional Care Program (TCP), which allows patients the opportunity to recuperate and recover in a supervised medical setting following hip/knee replacements, fractures, amputations or extended hospitalizations for pneumonia, congestive heart failure or other significant medical conditions. The program offers a modern rehabilitation gym dedicated to TCP patients and 24-hour care in skilled nursing beds, provided by a team of health care professionals.



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The Homestead at Soldiers & Sailors Memorial Hospital

The Homestead at Soldiers & Sailors Memorial Hospital, 418 North Main Street, Penn Yan, a 150 bed facility, offers 85 skilled nursing beds, 45 protected environment beds, 20 behavioral beds and 1 respite bed for scheduled short-term stays.

The Homestead offers traditional skilled nursing care, short term rehabilitation, a secure unit that provides care for cognitively-impaired individuals, and a behavioral unit for at-risk individuals with neurological diagnoses that cannot be managed elsewhere.

One bed at The Homestead is devoted to respite care. This program offers families relief from the care giving role as an option when the primary caregiver is ill, or would like to take a business trip or vacation. Respite care provides temporary, 24-hour skilled nursing care, nutritious meals and recreational activities.

Meaningful activities and social opportunities are enjoyed by our residents, including the HILT (Horticultural Intergenerational Learning as Therapy) program. HILT gives our residents an opportunity to share their knowledge of gardening with young people from the community.

Additionally, The Fire Side Inn offers a fine dining experience at The Homestead. Residents can enjoy a cozy, relaxing meal together with family and friends. It is open Monday through Friday, (with the exception of holidays) by reservation. Guests will be wined and dined with a candlelight dinner featuring an entrée from a special menu prepared by our chef.

Huntington Living Center

Huntington Living Center, 369 East Main Street, Waterloo, a 160-bed facility, offers 120 skilled nursing beds, and 40 dementia care beds on the newly-renovated Special Needs Unit, which specializes in the care of those with Alzheimer's and other dementia-related disorders.

The facility provides a broad range of skilled nursing and rehabilitative services as well as a diverse array of activities. We offer daily recreational programs, with a monthly calendar developed with direct input from the residents themselves. Our intergenerational program brings in school children of all ages to share their lives with our residents. The chapel allows for a quiet place for spirituality as well as providing an accessible room for regular services.

The facility's in-house Countryside Grille enables families and friends the opportunity to enjoy a fine dining experience with their loved one without having to leave the facility. Our chef has created a special menu of items, and is awaiting your reservation.

An attractive campus and active community spirit further enhance our facility. The newly remodeled lobby provides a beautiful sitting area for our residents and their families. The courtyard area boasts a brilliant array of plants and flowers with walking paths and a center gazebo. This same area also contains a covered pavilion, perfect for family gatherings or resident activities. All of our gardens, as well as many other amenities, are made possible through the tireless efforts of the Taylor-Brown Auxiliary and our wonderful staff of volunteers. They continue to reflect the values of our local community with our residents through their selfless work.

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Transitional Care Program

The Transitional Care Program is located at the Living Center at Geneva – South, 45 Mason Street, Geneva. Skilled nursing beds and a bright, up-to-date rehabilitation room are dedicated to the Transitional Care Program (TCP) which is intended for individuals seeking a short term rehabilitation stay, most often after an acute hospitalization. TCP is designed to meet the rehabilitative and physical needs of individuals while they are planning a discharge to home or "transitioning" to another level of care. The program complements the continuum of services offered by Finger Lakes Health.

TCP offers a comprehensive rehabilitation approach designed to improve the functional independence of individuals who have had hip/knee replacements, fractured bones, amputation, or a cardiovascular event. Individuals who have had extended hospitalizations for illnesses such as pneumonia, congestive heart failure or other health conditions often meet the criteria for this program.

The team of therapists provides rehabilitative services six days a week in our rehabilitation room. The therapists are supervised by a physical therapist who is a board-certified clinical specialist in geriatric physical therapy

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Individuals admitted to this program are provided with a semiprivate room. Limited private rooms are available, and preference is given to those with a specified medical need. The Living Center's first floor offers patients easy access to the patio areas, a bright spacious dining room, and a wide variety of leisure activities. Laundry, meal service, housekeeping and dental services are provided at no additional charge. In addition, standard cable and local telephone service is available, for a one-time fee. Piped-in wall oxygen is offered based upon medical need and availability.

Many insurance plans, including Medicare, Medicaid, MVP Care Gold, and Medicare Blue Choice, will provide coverage based upon your specific plan guidelines.

Dementia Care Units

Dementia Care Units are located at two facilities within the Finger Lakes Health's Long Term Care Division. All staff members are specially trained in dementia care, and this, combined with experience, offers our residents a unique and gentle approach to caregiving. Both units strive to create an environment of care that allows residents to maximize freedom for as long as possible. The unit programming provides a variety of useful and purposeful

activities that focus on life skills, as well as recreational and spiritual needs.

The Special Needs Unit at Huntington Living

Center in Waterloo provides a safe, secure environment exclusively for those diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease, or dementia-type disorders. The mission of this unit is to create an environment of care that allows the residents to maintain their independence for as long as possible.

This newly renovated 40bed unit has been specially designed to allow residents to alcoves consist of a media center, a nature center, and a nursery, along with ample sitting areas for residents to take rest breaks as

The unit's dining room overlooks a spacious outdoor courtyard that reaps the benefit of the involvement of our residents, families, staff, Taylor-Brown Auxiliary members and community volunteers. A

gazebo and large pavilion allow our residents and their families the opportunity to enjoy the outdoors together.

The Protected Environment at The Homestead offers a unique 45-bed secure unit that specializes in the care of residents with multiple cognitive impairments, as well as Alzheimer's disease and dementia.

The Protected Environment provides an enclosed outdoor courtyard for the enjoyment of our residents and their families. This enables residents to continue their active outdoor lifestyle in a safe environment. The circular design of the walkway surrounding the courtyard allows residents the opportunity to take a stroll while enjoying the beauty of the gardens. These gardens are enhanced and maintained by our Horticultural Intergenerational Learning as Therapy (HILT) program as well as involved residents, families,

staff and community volunteers.

The Life Enrichment Program (LEP) is an award winning care delivery model for long term care. LEP consists of multiple therapeutic activity modules specially designed for residents with Alzheimer's disease or dementia. The programs are flexible, stimulating, spontaneous and enhance resident social interactions and feelings of usefulness and purpose. The overall goals are to reduce falls, have a positive impact on behaviors, decrease wandering, improve appetite and enhance sleep. LEP is incorporated on our Dementia Care Units, as well as throughout the Finger Lakes Health Long Term Care Division.





Respite Care Services

Finger Lakes Health offers respite care services at two facilities: The Homestead at Soldiers & Sailors Memorial Hospital, 418 North Main Street, Penn Yan, and Living Center at Geneva – North, 75 Mason Street, Geneva.

Respite care is scheduled short-term care for an individual who may require nursing services for a specific period of time. The respite care program is intended to provide temporary relief to caregivers and to prolong an individual's ability to remain in the community by allowing the caregiver planned "breaks". Respite care is ideal for the caregiver who would like to take a much needed vacation or would like to pursue medical treatment for him or herself.

The respite care program offers all of the amenities that long-term residents are afforded, but in addition, our guest is accommodated in a private room with a private bath, a television and local telephone service.

Respite care offers caregivers peace of mind knowing their loved one is being cared for by a dedicated and caring staff, 24 hours a day, in a safe, comfortable environment.

Short-term residents may participate in a variety of recreational activities, which they can select from the extensive calendar of events. Staff ensures that all residents are invited to attend each activity. Staff members are readily available to assist with ambulating, eating and personal hygiene. The respite patient may eat in the beautifully decorated dining rooms or have their meal served in the privacy of their own room.

Respite care can be paid for privately, by Medicaid, some longterm care insurance policies or contracts with VA facilities.

Adult Day Health Services

The Adult Day Health Services program provides health care and social interaction for adults in a friendly and safe environment, while at the same time offering rest, support and counseling to family/caregivers. Finger Lakes Health's Adult Day Health Services Program is offered at three locations:

Home Away From Home

The Homestead at Soldiers & Sailors Memorial Hospital,

Geneva Adult Day Health Center 116 Lewis Street, Geneva

Waterloo Adult Day Health Center

Huntington Living Center, Waterloo

Program participants attend from one to five days each week at the Centers. They can enjoy socialization with other seniors in a stimulating and encouraging group setting, and leisure time activities, which include music, arts, crafts, gardening, field trips and outings. Hot, nutritious meals are served and meet individual dietary requirements. Registrants have access to medical services in the health system's facilities, health care monitoring and skilled nursing care, as well as case management and counseling services. Family members may transport participants, or Adult Day Health Services staff can assist in making transportation arrangements, including bus transportation, which is available to registrants. The Adult Day Health Services Program provides participants the avenue to remain independent and continue living in the community. Adult Day Health Care costs are covered for Medicaid-eligible participants. Private pay rates are available, upon request. The Homestead Behavioral Unit

The Homestead Behavioral Unit is a program dedicated to providing intervention for long-term care residents whose behaviors could be detrimental to themselves or others, and whose care cannot be managed in a traditional long-term care

The mission of this unit is to maximize continuity of care and long-

term rehabilitation benefits for the resident by actively involving and educating care providers prior to, during and following treatment. This specialized unit is designed to stabilize and modify behaviors caused by a neurological impairment, which have been present for more than 30 days and which have not abated after other interventional attempts.

through interventions. The unit is accessible by an authorized kevpad and doorbell.


Staff on the unit are specially trained and dedicated in sufficient numbers to provide individualized care and allow for small group activities. Staff members include a program coordinator, physician with specialized training and experience in the care of individuals with severe behavioral and neuro-psychiatric conditions, qualified specialist in psychiatry, Master's-prepared social worker, therapeutic recreation specialist, registered nurses, licensed practical nurses and certified nurses' assistants.

The length of stay is based on the response to treatment, but most individuals remain in the program for at least six months. The Homestead Behavioral Unit is one of four such programs in

- Exit the Thruway at Exit #42.
- After the tollbooth, turn right onto Route 14 South.
- Travel south about 5 miles. Route 14S will turn into Exchange Street.
- At the traffic light (the corner of Exchange and North Streets); turn right onto North Street.
 You will notice blue hospital direction signs. Geneva General Hospital Campus will be on your right
- Take a right onto Mason Street. You will pass the Emergency Department.
- The Living Center South is the first living center on the left hand side.
- You may park in either of the two parking lots on the right.
- The Living Center North is the second living center on the left hand side. You may park in either of the two parking lots on the right.

- When coming from Buffalo, Rochester, Albany or Syracuse, the easiest way to travel to Waterloo is by the New York State Thruway, Interstate 90.
- Exit the Thruway at Exit #41.
- After the tollbooth, turn right onto Route 414 South.
- Travel South about 5 miles.
- At the second traffic light the corner of Routes 5&20 and Route 414; turn right onto Main Street (Routes 5&20 West).
- Go about ½ mile on Routes 5&20 West and you will see a sign on the right for Huntington Living Center. (The Huntington Living Center sits back from the road.)
- Turn right at the sign and follow the driveway down. Turn right off the driveway and park in the front entrance parking lot. You may park in the lot off to the left of the building if the front entrance lot is full.

HOMESTEAD AT SOLDIERS & SAILORS MEMORIAL HOSPITAL FROM THE NORTH

- Take the NYS Thruway to Exit 42.
- After the tollbooth, turn right at the light onto Route 14 South.
- Travel south about 5 miles. Route 14S will turn into Exchange Street.
- At the first traffic light the corner of Exchange and North Streets; turn right onto North Street. Go straight though the next 4 stoplights.
- At the 5th stoplight, turn left on to Pre-Emption Road.
- Continue until you reach the next stoplight. This will be Routes 5&20.
- Turn right at the stoplight on to Routes 5&20. At the next stoplight, take a left on to Route 14A South.
- Stay on Route 14A S —The route has many curves. Eventually you will come to the town of Hall and a 4 way stop sign. At the intersection, turn left. You are still on Route 14A South.
- Continue 9 miles into the town of Penn Yan. At the first stoplight, take a left on to North Ave. When you come to the stop sign, take another left onto Main Street.
- The Homestead is on the left and is a gray/pink building. Parking is available in the front lot or in the lot to the left of the building.

FROM THE SOUTH

- Follow Route 14 North to the intersection of Route 54.
- Turn left on Route 54
- Follow Route 54 (Clinton St.) until the intersection of Main St.
- Take a right on to Main St.
- The Homestead is on the left and is a gray/pink building.

Parking is available in the front lot or in the lot to the left of the building.
