ECONOMIC & COMMUNITY BENEFITS

Economic activity

The economic activity generated by hospitals through jobs and the purchasing of goods and services makes up 10.0% of the state's entire gross domestic product.

Jobs generated

Hospitals and health systems are often the largest employers in communities, generate many more jobs, and are top 10 private sector employers in every region of New York.

Payroll expenditures

New York hospitals' #1 investment is in their people, including direct salary and benefits to their employees.

Tax dollars generated

New York hospitals generate significant tax dollars and stimulate the economies of local communities and the whole state.

Community benefits & investments

Adhering to their charitable mission, hospitals cover the cost of care provided to people in need; subsidize care and services to low-income, elderly and under-served communities; and continuously invest in many community health initiatives.

STATE & FEDERAL FUNDING

Reimbursement from Medicare & Medicaid

A large share of hospital reimbursement comes from Medicare and Medicaid, which do not cover the cost of care. This underpayment is driven by large volumes of inpatient and outpatient services provided to individuals covered by these public insurance programs.

Community Benefit

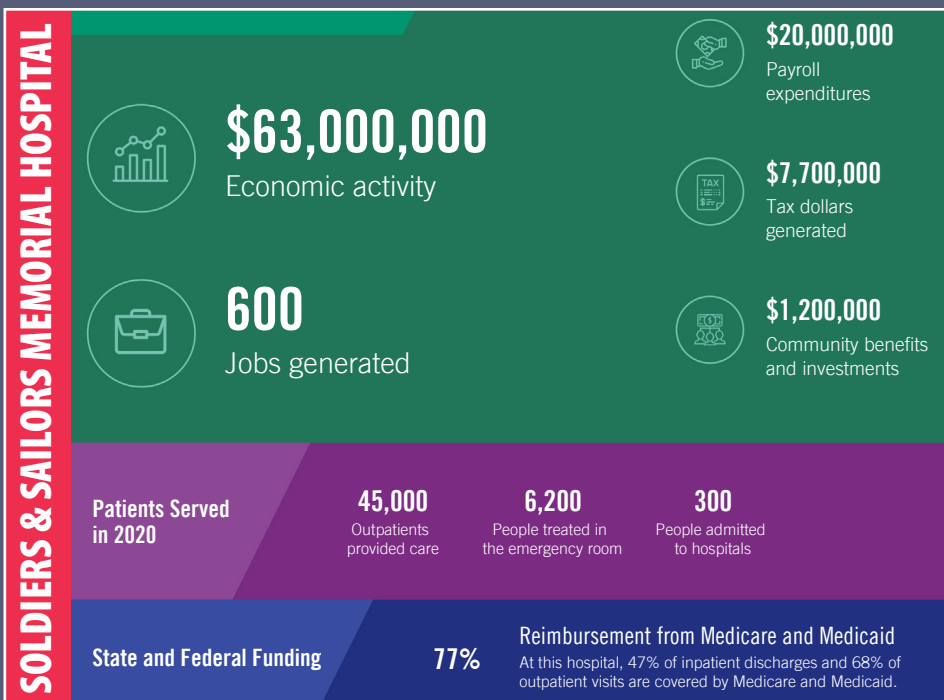
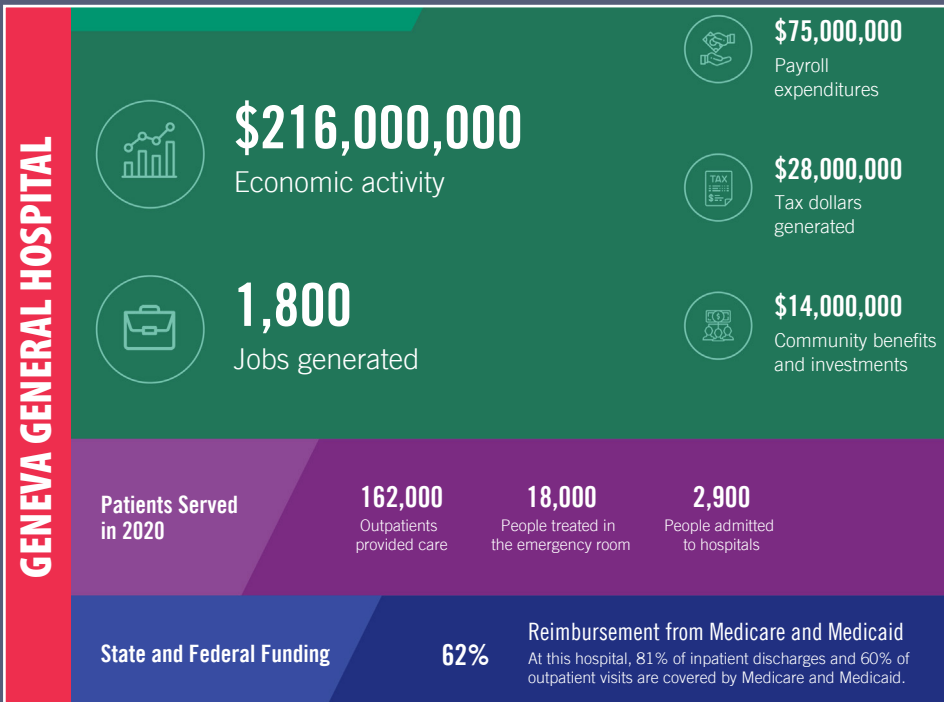
In partnership with Ontario County Public Health, Seneca County Public Health, Yates County Public Health, SAY2 Rural Health Network/Pivotal Health and Common Ground Health, Finger Lakes Health conducted a Community Health Needs Assessment and Community Services plan to guide our community health efforts for 2019-2021. The Community Health Needs Assessment process involved surveys, focus groups, analysis of disease prevalence data and priority setting dialogue and meetings with a broad range of community partners and stakeholders. Using the framework of the New York State Prevention Agenda, we identified two key priority areas for 2019-2021 and worked to identify evidence-based interventions to address these priorities:

- 1) Prevention of Chronic Disease
- 2) Promote Well-Being and Prevent Mental and Substance Abuse Disorders

Finger Lakes Health and each of our three counties developed multi-year action plans targeting these priorities. Prevention of Chronic Disease

For prevention of chronic disease, we focused efforts to increase cancer screening rates for breast cancer and colon cancer with mammography screening and colon cancer screening. To address health disparities, we focused efforts to ensure that individuals with lower socio-economic status and the uninsured have access to screening. It has been of concern that during the COVID-19 pandemic, many in our communities have not been seeking preventive care. We employed myriad outreach strategies including walk-in mammogram dates each month to provide increased convenience and access at Geneva General Women's Health Services and Soldiers & Sailors Memorial Hospital. We have also worked through Cancer Screening Services to advertise that mammograms are available at low and no cost. We also have made funds available for any patient needing to return for a diagnostic mammogram to assure cost is not a barrier.

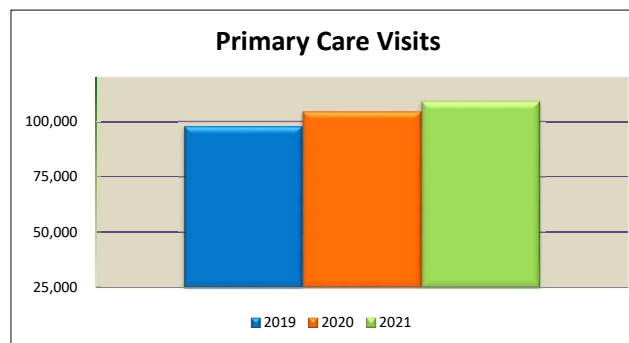
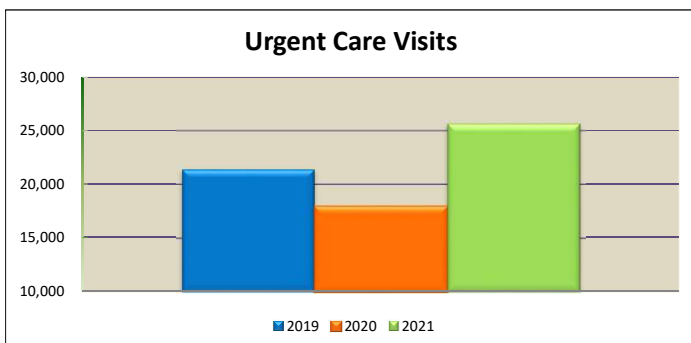
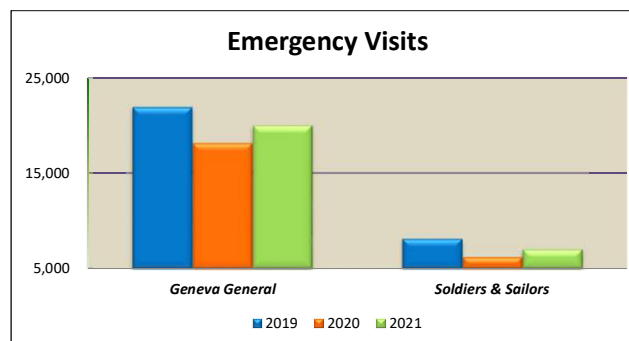
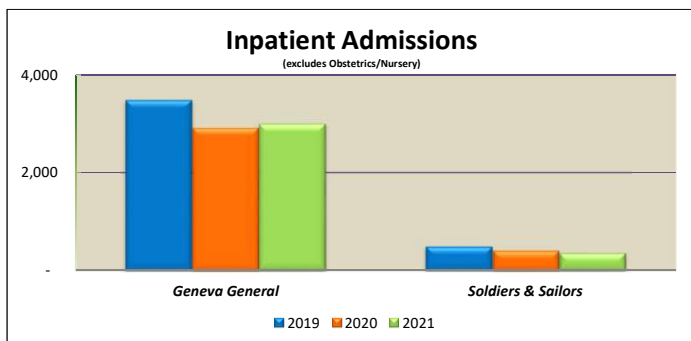
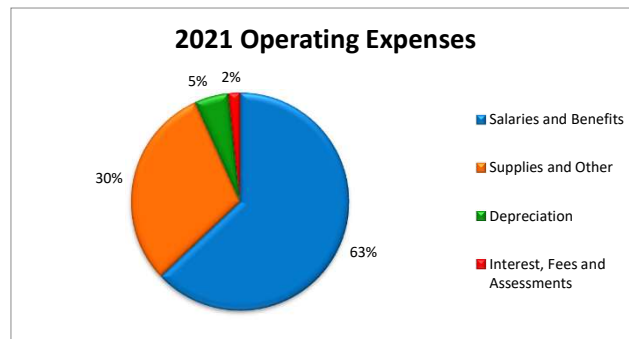
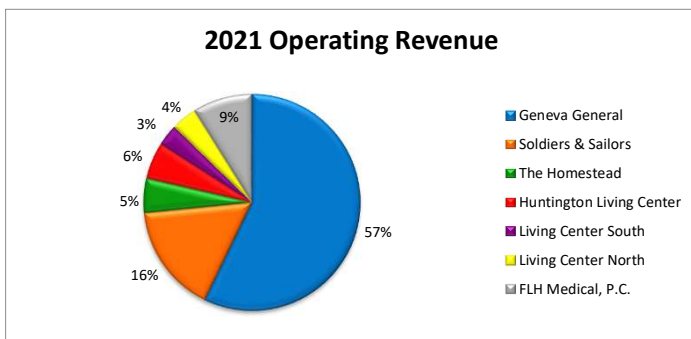




In addition, our primary care physician practices and gastroenterology practice utilize the electronic medical record to prompt patient reminders for screening colonoscopies. We have communicated the updated colorectal cancer screening guidelines on our regular radio show, our direct mail publications, as well as through print and social media campaigns.

Prevent Mental Health and Substance Abuse Disorders

Finger Lakes Health representatives participated in the Yates County with Systems of Care Planning meetings to address mental health needs. In addition, Finger Lakes Health offers individual and group therapy through the John D. Kelly Clinic. We have also enhanced our capabilities for and delivery of telemedicine services to expand access.

Finger Lakes Health is committed to providing compassionate care to every member of our community, regardless of their ability to pay. It is this philosophy that guides us as a not-for-profit healthcare system. If you do not have health insurance, or think you may not be able to pay in full for your care provided by Geneva General Hospital or Soldiers & Sailors Memorial Hospital, we can help through our Financial Aid Program, also known as "charity care." Financial aid is available to assist uninsured or underinsured members of our community who are willing, but unable to pay in part or full for their care. Financial Aid is based on your income, assets, and needs. In addition, we may be able to help you obtain free or low-cost health insurance, or work with you to establish a manageable payment plan.

As a not-for-profit health system, we return any operating surplus to the people in our community in several ways:

We provide care for those who cannot afford to pay. Many of the costs to deliver the vital services we offer are not fully covered by government programs like Medicare, Medicaid or private insurance plans.

We subsidize the difference between the cost to deliver services and the payments from public and private insurance programs.

We reinvest in new services and programs, as well as maintenance and enhancements to facilities, property and equipment to serve our communities.

We develop programs, community wellness initiatives and educational opportunities to meet community health needs, a few of which are outlined in this report.
